Jn. 1:29-31, Mt. 3:14-17  
& Lk. 4:1-2

John 1:29: Jesus is introduced as the \_\_\_\_\_  
\_\_\_\_\_ – God's sacrifice to spare us.

Matthew 3:14: Why was Jesus baptized?

- 1) It was the ultimate \_\_\_\_\_ of John's ministry.
- 2) Just as we identify with Jesus' \_\_\_\_\_

Matthew 3:16-17: All 3 persons of the \_\_\_\_\_

The Father had told John what would happen at the  
baptism of the Messiah (see John 1:33-34).

The Father's words over Jesus are a reference to Psalm 2  
& Isaiah 42.

Jesus' baptism was His ordination and marked the  
beginning of Jesus' public ministry.

Jesus begins His ministry by acting out His own \_\_\_\_\_

In baptism, going under the water represents the death  
of Jesus and coming out of the water represents the  
resurrection of Jesus.

It's a physical act to signify what God has already done  
on the inside of us.
