Question: What is the distinguishing mark between those who will enter Christ's Kingdom when He returns and those who will not?


Who will not?
Answer: Those who love will be the ones who enter into His Kingdom when He returns. This love for Jesus will be evidenced by the way a person

A Definition of Love: Love sacrificially of itself for the benefit of the object of it's affection
For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life John 3:16
No one takes it from me, <u>but I lay it down of my own accord</u> . I have authority to lay it down, and I have authority to take it up again. This charge I have received from my Father John 10:18
