Who is "The Destroyer"?

- See 1 Chronicles 21:15-16 and 2 Samuel 24:16-17, which record the Angel of The Lord destroying Jerusalem.
- In the Old Testament the only angel who appears with a drawn sword is the Angel of the Lord (Cf. Joshua 5:13 and Numbers 22:23).
- The Lord repeatedly takes ownership of the 10th plague in Exodus 11-12, and 4 times in the Psalms (78:48-51; 105:26, 36; 135:5, 8; 136:3, 10; while Psalm 78 may appear at first to indicate a delegated "normal" angel, closer inspection of the text will reveal God still taking ownership).

"the Father judges no one, but has committed all judgment to the Son" - John 5:22

Then He said to Abram: "Know certainly that your descendants will be strangers in a land that is not theirs, and will serve them, and they will afflict them four hundred years. And also the nation whom they serve I will judge; afterward they shall come out with great possessions." - Genesis 15:13-14
