C.6.VV.13-14 list the charges against Stephen:

... "This man never stops speaking against this holy place and the law. For we heard him say that this Jesus of Nazareth will destroy this place (the Temple) and change the customs that Moses handed down to us." ...two (false witnesses) who came forward stated, "This man said, 'I can destroy the temple of God and rebuild it in three days.'" - Matthew 26:60-61 (the trial of Jesus)

Jesus answered, "Destroy this temple, and I will raise it up in three days." Therefore the Jews said, "This temple took forty-six years to build, and will you raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking about the temple of his body. So when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the Scripture and the statement Jesus had made. - John 2:19-22
