

Acts 7:9-43 Stephen (Part 2) Speaker: Jeff Thompson

C.6.VV.13-14 list the charges against Stephen:

... "This man never stops speaking against this holy place and the law. For we heard him say that this Jesus of Nazareth will destroy this place (the Temple) and change the customs that Moses handed down to us."

Points from Stephen's Speech:

- VV.9-10, 17, 29-34: God has never needed a holy Temple, city, or land to meet with His people.

...God highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee will bow - in heaven and on earth and under the earth - and every tongue will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. - Philippians 2:9-11

VV.13, 34: Israel only received Joseph and Moses the second time they came to them. So it shall be with

"Then I will pour out a spirit of grace and prayer on the house of David and the residents of Jerusalem, and they will look at me whom they pierced. They will mourn for him as one mourns for an only child and weep bitterly for him as one weeps for a firstborn. - Zechariah 12:1

On that day a fountain will be opened for the house of David and for the residents of Jerusalem, to wash away sin and impurity. - Zechariah 13:1 Cross reference **V.22** with Luke 24:19: "...Jesus of Nazareth, who was <u>a prophet powerful in action and</u> <u>speech</u> before God and all the people..."

Cross-reference **V.27** with Luke 19:14 and John 19:15: "We don't want this man to rule over us." "We have no king but Caesar!"

- V.30: Israel's rejection of God's deliverer (Moses)

The LORD your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among your own brothers. <u>You must listen to him</u>. - Exodus 18:15

I (God) will raise up for them a prophet like you (Moses) from among their brothers. I will put my words in his mouth, and he will tell them everything I command him. <u>I will hold accountable</u> whoever does not listen to my words that he speaks in my name. - Exodus 18:18-19

"This truly is the Prophet who is to come into the world." - John 6:14

- V.39: Israel's ancestors loved _____ more

This is the judgment: The light has come into the world, and people loved darkness rather than the light because their deeds were evil. For everyone who does evil hates the light and avoids it, so that his deeds may not be exposed. - John 3:19-20
