

Revelation 18 The Fall of Economic Babylon Speaker: Jeff Thompson

Revelation 18 details God's judgment of \_\_\_\_\_

Babylon, the world's \_\_\_\_\_\_ system.

As best we can tell, God will accomplish this by destroying the literal city of Babylon.

This chapter appears to unfold around the same time as the 7<sup>th</sup> and final bowl judgment (Cf. Revelation 16:17-19).

V.2: In this context, "bird" is an additional figurative term for demons and foul spirits.

Babylon in Daniel 5 parallels Babylon in Revelation 18.

"They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. Sanctify them by Your truth. <u>Your word</u> is truth." - John 17:16-17

Also see Romans 12:2; 2 Corinthians 6:14-17; James 1:27, 4:4; 1 John 2:15.

V.4: \_\_\_\_\_\_ illuminates a way to live in Babylon without becoming part of Babylon.

V.8: Economic Babylon will burn to the ground in a

...Babylon, the glory of kingdoms, the beauty of the Chaldeans' pride, will be <u>as when God overthrew Sodom and Gomorrah</u>. It will <u>never</u> be inhabited, nor will it be settled from generation to generation; nor will the Arabian pitch tents there, nor will the shepherds make their sheepfolds there. - Isaiah 13:19-20

V.13: "bodies" = slaves (sōma)
"souls" = life, mind, heart (psychē)
Together, they likely refer to sex trafficking

## V.23: Babylon will be destroyed in an age where "the great men of the earth" are

"\_\_\_\_\_" (I.E. <u>businessmen</u>).

See Ephesians 6:12 & 1 John 5:19

"You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a lampstand, and it gives light to all who are it gives light to all who are <u>in the house</u>. – Matthew 5:14-15

Contrast Revelation 18 with Luke 12:16-21, James 5:1-8, and Laodicea in Revelation 3:17-22.

...what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world, and loses his own soul? - Mark 8:36

Also see Matthew 6:19-20
